OUTCOME: 6 cancer prevention, treatment or supportive services talks scheduled with a total of 90 participants in attendance.

Children's Health Fairs

3/19 Children's Health and Wellness Day at Westlake High School. Outreach Nurses had Interactions with 125 high school students educating about the dangers of smoking, e-cigarettes and liquid nicotine, Hookahs, flavored tobacco and chewing tobacco. Also 200 students were engaged in interactive activities and education about drinking and cancer.

5/15 Health fair at Bay Middle school included: the dangers of smoking, e-cigarettes and liquid nicotine, Hookahs and flavored tobacco and chewing tobacco, also, skin health and melanoma information. There were approximately 280 interactions with middle school students. There were another 250 interactions with students engaged in educational activities about drinking and cancer.

11/18 Smoking Education at Westlake Lee Burneson Middle School included Outreach nurses speaking with 575 students and answering questions about the dangers of smoking including: Hookahs, clove cigarettes, flavored cigarettes, e-cigarettes, liquid nicotine, chewing tobacco, and cigars.

Outcome: There were 855 interactions with students who participated in activities or visited the informational literature tables provided. Also questions, concerns, information, and prevention of drinking and smoking related cancers were addressed. Middle and High School students participated in lung health education and participated in an interactive game (Smoking Jeopardy) to learn about different types of smoking, nicotine and cancer.

Prevention – Exercise

Spring/Fall 2015; Six Week Walking and Wellness Challenge between area Senior Centers for participants over 50 years old.

Outcome: Regular physical activity can improve health and can also also affect the risk of cancer. Walkers participate in biometric screening (weight/height/BMI/Waist Circumference/Blood Pressure/Blood Glucose/Blood Cholesterol) Participants were provided pedometers, then walk for six weeks, and are rescreened. Two sessions were provided, spring and fall. In each session, with 65 walkers, participants lost over 130 lbs. collectively, dropped cholesterol levels by 600 points, lowered blood pressure, improved blood glucose levels, and walked over 13 million steps with an average of 322,376 steps (10,000 steps = 5 miles) per person.
